## Sutton Green Sports Grant Report - 2015-16

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum for 2015 to 2016 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding – provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport – has been allocated to primary school head teachers.

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

## Purpose of funding

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but schools have been given the freedom to choose how they do this. A list of possible uses has been suggested.

Sutton Green Primary School has decided to use the money to:

- employ our PE coordinator to work alongside our teachers when teaching PE in order to strengthen teaching and learning in this subject across the school
- support and engage the least active children in physical activities by providing a wide range of activities
- pay for professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport
- increase pupils' participation in the sports and physical activities
- provide places for pupils on after school sports clubs
- improve resources to support the development of the subject

The impact of the use of the grant will be reviewed at the end of each year and a report presented to Governors.
