PE and Sports Grant 2020-21



The Government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum to provide new, substantial primary school sport funding. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school Headteachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all of their children.

This sport funding can only be spent on provision of sport and PE and sport in schools.

Department for Education's Purpose of Funding

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they have been given the freedom to choose how they do this.

Possible uses for the funding:

- Employ our PE coordinator / Specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside our teachers when teaching PE in order to strengthen teaching and learning in this subject across the school
- Support and engage the least active children in physical activities by providing a wide range of activities
- Pay for professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport (and pay for cover to release teachers to attend)
- Running sports competitions or increasing pupils' participation in the sports and physical activities / school games
- Provide places for pupils on new or additional sports clubs
- Improve resources to support the development of the subject
- Membership to professional sports partnerships

		<u>Extra-curricular Activities</u> To work with the PE lead to deliver high quality extra-curricular sports engaging all pupils.		COVID: All pupils should have had the opportunity to take part in a variety of PE clubs or activities at some point in the year, delivered by a highly qualified coach. COVID: Pupils should have been introduced to sports, some competitive, which they may not have been able to access previously, giving them the confidence to participate in a sport outside of school.
		<u>CPD</u> Teachers to access CPD from professionals, team teach and quality provision and skills to be modelled by coaches		COVID: Teachers should have been able to observe high quality PE teaching on a weekly basis, giving themselves confidence in the delivery of the second PE lesson of the week. Pupils would have benefited from having two high quality lessons taught every week. In the previous academic year - 79% of staff felt more confident delivering PE lessons having observed the Vara coach' lessons on a regular basis.
		<u>COVID Teacher Support</u> Researching for and creating resources for socially distanced PE lessons enabling the continuation of high quality PE lessons.	Additional Cost: Supply cover for PE lead 3 days at £120/ day Total £360	Teachers were enabled to teach socially distanced PE lessons throughout lockdown, providing their pupils, both in class and isolating at home, with a wide variety of age appropriate lesson plans, videos and links. Pupils continue to receive quality PE/exercise ideas during lockdown when their usual means of exercise (school, clubs etc), were not available.
